About the Delegates

Do you know what the Delegates on the NRLHF board do? First, these folks are voted in at rendezvous by attendees like you and they are volunteers and serve a two year term. No money is exchanged for the time and involvement each member of the board puts in. Your board members believe in the NRLHF and fight for the good of the organization. Monthly Zoom meetings are held, voice recorded and minutes are taken. Motions are made, seconded, discussed and then voted upon. Your delegates are in charge of finding the next rendezvous location, view and approve the site to be voted on at Rendezvous. Then they work with the Booshway to help develop the budget, review the Booshway "book" (this used to be a binder, now electronic files) and work in the background to help ensure the event goes off without issues.

Currently there are two delegates for each event. With our ever dwindling attendance at events, this is quite the accomplishment! COVID 19 hit the organization hard and took the coffers down to a couple of hundred bucks in 2020. Since then the team has been diligently trying to keep expenses down, figure out new ways to bring in additional money and work on realistic budgets. This is one of the reasons why pre-registration is so very important. The delegate and Booshway need to know how many port-a-jons to reserve, and how many times to have them serviced. Also what size and how many dumpsters to reserve, how many medallions to order, how much wood to have on hand, how many water buffalos to have and the means to fill them.

I know we did - prior to our first Eastern Primitive Rendezvous way back in 1988! Now here we are and its Corps of Discovery's 19th year (it took a good year to gain the NRLHF board's approval). This event still needs an Archery Captain, and someone to run the Hawk and Knife. There will also be opportunities to volunteer for other activities throughout the week.

Campfire Cooking

<u>Creamy Cucumber Salad by George Fischer</u> Ingredients:

4 large Cucumbers

1 medium Sweet Onion

1 cup Mayonnaise

1/2 cup White Sugar

1/4 cup White Vinegar

Salt and Pepper to taste.

Directions:

Wash, peel and thinly slice 4 large cucumbers. Use a mandolin for uniformity.

Thinly slice 1 medium sweet onion.

Place the sliced cucumbers and onions in a ceramic, glass or plastic bowl that has a lid.

In a small bowl combine mayonnaise, sugar and vinegar. Mix until smooth.

Turn the mayonnaise mixture into the cucumber and onion mixture, combine well.

Salt and pepper to taste.

Cover with a lid, shake lightly.

Allow to marinate in the refrigerator for a minimum of 6 hours (overnight works well).

Refrigerate leftovers.

Makes 6 servings of Creamy Cucumber Salad
